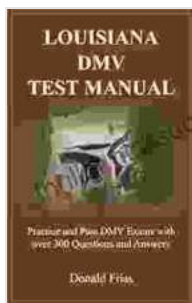

- Be at least 15 years old

- Have a parent or guardian who is at least 21 years old and willing to supervise your driving
- Be a resident of Louisiana for at least 30 days
- Have a valid Social Security number

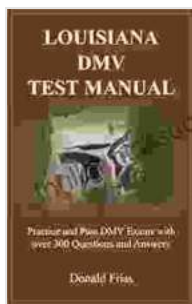
