Materials

- Fishing line (80-100 lb. test monofilament or braided line)
- Swivel
- Snap swivel
- Weight (1-2 oz. egg sinker or pyramid sinker)
- Hook (5/0-7/0 circle hook or J-hook)

- Bait (live bait, cut bait, or soft plastic bait)

Instructions

1. Tie the Line to the Swivel

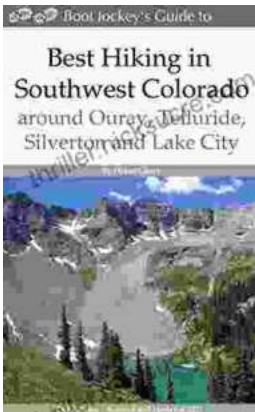

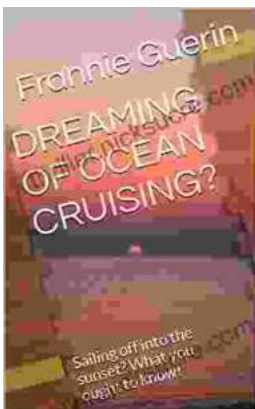
